A Commitment to the Mission



As the Founder and CEO of Hearts With A Mission, it has been incredibly rewarding to witness the transformative impact we have made over the past 15 years. Today, we proudly serve more than 1,000 individuals annually, helping to change the lives of youth, families, and seniors in our communities—an accomplishment made possible through your unwavering support.

Your generosity has played a pivotal role in enabling our success.

Several key moments stand out, such as the donation of the property where our youth shelter now stands, and the timely \$105,000 contribution that arrived precisely when we needed to cover \$103,000 in outstanding expenses for the City Life Building. In addition, a \$250,000 gift from the West Family Foundation empowered us to purchase this space and continue expanding our services. These milestones, and many others, would not have been possible without your steadfast belief in our mission.

Thanks to your support, we now operate Safe Families for Children (SFFC) in six Oregon counties—Jackson, Josephine, Lincoln, Klamath, Douglas, and Coos—helping families remain united during challenging times. Additionally, we serve vulnerable youth through our shelter for 10-17-year-olds and our Independent Living Program (ILP) for those aged 14-24. In Jackson and Josephine counties, our Transitional Living Program equips young adults aged 18-21 with essential life skills, helping them build successful futures.

Your contributions have also been instrumental in supporting our Hearts For Seniors initiative, through which we have facilitated 2,790 companion visits and completed 675 home improvement projects for seniors in Jackson County. This program provides companionship and practical assistance, helping seniors maintain their independence and alleviating the effects of isolation.

Every act of generosity brings hope and renewal to those we serve. You are making a tangible difference in the lives of children, families, and seniors within our community. On behalf of everyone at Hearts With A Mission, I extend our deepest gratitude for your continued partnership and support.

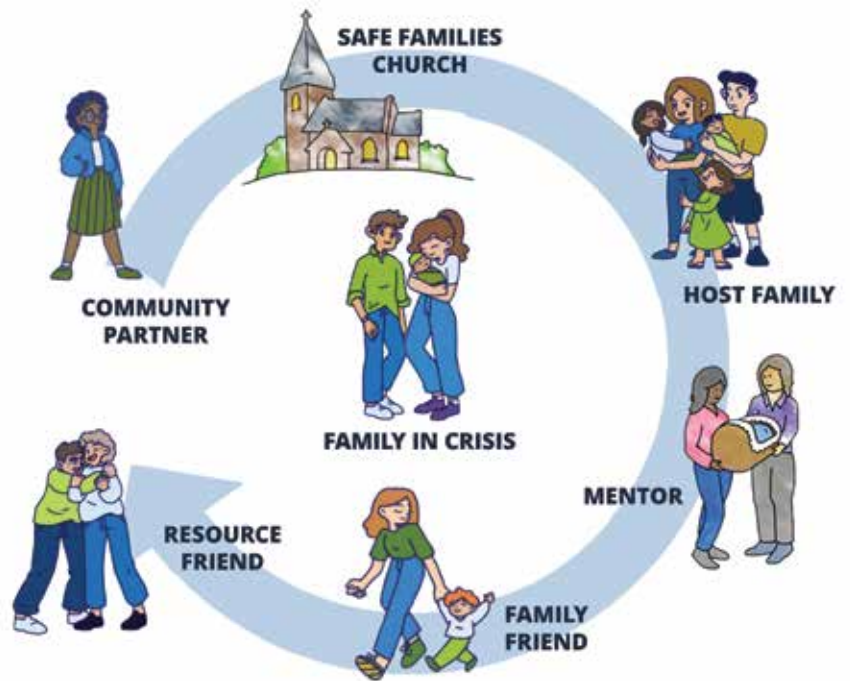
HWAM celebrates 10-Years with Safe Families

Reflecting on our Safe Families for Children (SFFC) journey, it is incredible to see how far we've come. Ten years ago, we brought the SFFC program to Jackson County to help our young people who did not have a home to return to after their stay in the youth shelter.

Since then, we have added chapters in five other counties: Josephine, Lincoln, Klamath, Douglas, and Coos.

Initially, we just did overnight hostings with Circle of Support Services; now, we have added day hosting and mentorship for parents and youth. These additions have improved our ability to provide comprehensive support to families in crisis.

Going forward our chapters are working to offer youth and family-focused groups, to provide isolated families connection within their communities. We want to give a special thank you to all of our supporters and volunteers who are investing in the lives of our youth and families.

Christmas in July

We celebrated “Christmas in July” when Living Hope Church blessed our program with acts of kindness that truly made a significant difference. Many of our seniors face severe mobility and financial challenges, making it difficult for them to manage essential tasks on their own. For example, Olivia often found herself stuck in the mud when trying to navigate her wheelchair to the street for crucial medical appointments. Thanks to our collaboration with Living Hope, we were able to install a ramp that now allows her to reach the street safely.



During this hot July, volunteers installed two ramps and paved a driveway for another senior. They also completed a dump run and undertook several major yard makeover projects. Both our staff and the seniors we serve have felt profoundly blessed by this support, especially

those battling cancer and other serious health issues. We are deeply grateful to the volunteers who have stepped in to alleviate these burdens.

Since launching Hearts For Seniors in January 2023, we have been able to assist over 150 seniors. We’ve learned that both the small and big things can have a significant impact. Our partnership with the Red Cross has been instrumental in providing essential home maintenance and a durable medical device loaner program. Thanks to this collaboration, many seniors have received wheelchairs, walkers, shower chairs, and other items that help them navigate their homes safely. We have also welcomed over 115 volunteers who have been essential in delivering these services. We couldn’t serve our seniors without their dedication, and we are immensely grateful for everyone who has contributed.

Many seniors in our community fall outside the eligibility criteria for existing assistance programs. We are working hard to address these gaps but need more help to broaden our reach and support even more individuals. We receive daily referrals for seniors in need of assistance. If you would like to support our efforts, please call us. The time commitment is minimal, but the impact you can make is profound.
