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
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## LETTER FROM DIRECTOR

At Safe Families, we believe that social isolation is the primary issue for families on the brink of child welfare involvement. As the epidemic of loneliness and isolation continues as a major public health concerns, the U.S. Surgeon General reported "48% of parents say their stress was completely overwhelming most days." When social isolation is coupled with other life stressors, such as poverty, housing insecurity, and mental health challenges, it is imperative that local communities colloberate for shared responsibility and solutions. Our goal is to bring both the church and community together to offer hope and support.

"As a therapist, I have seen so many mothers and children who needed that extra support through someone who genuinely loves their children -- someone who they can know is a safe person, who they can call at any time of the day or night to help - and I had nowhere to refer them.

I think about a mom I saw five years ago who struggled with bipolar disorder. She was a caring mom but in desperate need of people to watch her children, bring meals, or come over once or twice a week when she struggled with depressive episodes. There was nowhere for me to send her at the time and so we did what we could in therapy. Safe Families would have made a huge difference in her life and the lives of her children. That is only one of the many families I can share who could have used something like Safe Families."



#### **LETTER FROM A PARTNER PASTOR**

Safe Families is utterly unique and indispensable in its capacity to create relationships of trust and support for these families experiencing crisis. The friendships created with Safe Families volunteers form bonds similar to those of extended family. I have been impressed with how comforting it is for children to step into a home environment where there is already social trust established, and how much stress is alleviated for parents by a relational and noninstitutional path to receive help with childcare. I have seen how this organization creates a lifeline for parents who need short term or extended care for their children to deal with emergencies, chronic difficulties, or even just to get a break from the unrelenting demands of parenting.

As a pastor, I have also been struck by the way in which this ministry alleviates the **relational poverty** of those who open their lives and homes to families in crisis.

They find themselves in alignment with the ethical demands of their faith, they find their personal agency increased, they find that they are doing something meaningful to overcome the massive social challenges in this city.

Communities of faith are the institutions best situated in our society to build social capital and accompany families in crisis. The genius of Safe Families is its ability to tap into these preexisting networks and help them be attuned to the needs of the vulnerable children and parents that they are already primed to care for. The concreteness and effectiveness of the aid rendered by Safe Families is the reason that it is the organization I am most committed to seeing my church support.

I'm a single dad. I was living at a sober house and Asher couldn't be with me there. I needed help with my baby for about a month while I transitioned into having a space of my own.

I was connected with Safe Families, and they told me that a family was volunteering to watch Asher so I could find housing. I felt like I was just handing over my son to a couple of strangers. But the first time I dropped him off it was plain to see how loved he was by their kids and the family. There is never been a doubt that he was in really good hands when he was with Safe Families.

It's not easy being a single dad, but I wouldn't trade it for the world. It's been so helpful to not have to do it alone. Having friends and people that care about me has been really nice."


## **CREATING CIRCLES OF SUPPORT**




